For those services not offered at Alamance Regional Medical Center, patients will gain access to Cone Health’s expanded network. Alamance Regional Medical Center will retain its name and identity.

The addition of Alamance Regional and its 2,300 employees allows Cone Health to broaden its service area, spread costs and create a more efficient network. There are no plans for layoffs.

In addition to enhanced and expanded healthcare options, the partnership will provide significant resources for additional philanthropic and community non-profit support through a hospital foundation funded by Cone Health.
